

## **Energy-Efficient Home Improvement Tax Credit Eligibility Form**

#### **Instructions:**

Check the boxes below for any home improvements you've made or plan to make. The form will help you calculate the potential tax credits you may qualify for.

# 1. Qualified Energy Efficiency Improvements

(30% of costs, with caps)

#### Exterior Doors

- Installed energy-efficient exterior doors
- o Credit: 30% of costs, up to 250 per door(max 250per door(max 500 total for multiple doors).

#### Exterior Windows and Skylights

- Installed energy-efficient windows or skylights
- Credit: 30% of costs, up to \$600 total.

## Insulation and Air Sealing

- o Added insulation materials or systems
- Installed air sealing materials or systems
- o Credit: 30% of costs, up to \$1,200 total.

## 2. Residential Energy Property Expenditures

(30% of costs, including labor)

## **Property with a \$600 Cap per Item**

- Central air conditioners
- Natural gas, propane, or oil water heaters
- Natural gas, propane, or oil furnaces or hot water boilers
- Oil furnaces or hot water boilers meeting specific requirements



 Panelboards, sub-panelboards, branch circuits, or feeders (enabling property for energy-efficient improvements)

#### **Property with No \$600 Cap**

- Electric or natural gas heat pump water heaters
- Electric or natural gas heat pumps
- Biomass stoves or boilers meeting specific requirements

# 3. Home Energy Audits

- Conducted a home energy audit
  - o Credit: 30% of the cost, up to \$150.
